Privacy statement A.S.R. BLOK

In this privacy statement, we would like to inform you about the way your data is collected and how we handle it. We will explain where we store your data and for what purposes these are stored. Furthermore, you will read about your rights regarding your data and how you can use these.

Our goal

The aim of the association is to perform activities in the field of equestrian sports. Practicing and promoting them, as well as promoting amicitia.

Collection of personal data

Your personal data are collected by us for several purposes. Firstly, almost all our communication is through e-mail, for this it is important that we have your correct e-mail address. Sometimes it is convenient that we can reach you quickly and we use your telephone number for that. Furthermore, it is of course important for us to know whether you are a student or working. This way we can determine the costs of the lessons for you personally. To verify that you really live in Amsterdam, you are also asked to give us your home address. Finally, we use pre-authorized debit to collect the lessons and your further costs incurred. For this we need your bank details.

All data is collected by us via the registration form and only processed with your explicit consent or to implement the agreements that are entered, or because processing is necessary for the purposes mentioned in this privacy statement.

Processing data

Your data, both general (personal) and special (image), are stored on our secured Google Drive. Access to this Drive only has the current board of the association with login details that are changed each year. Your personal data and images that are collected during our activities are carefully stored.

We will never place individual photos of you and your name on public pages, such as our website, public Facebook page and Instagram, without your permission.

Receivers

Your email address is stored in the mail application from Google so that we can easily communicate with you and the rest of the members (via mailing lists) and can inform you of various activities, including the monthly collection.

Furthermore, your general information is sent annually to the student sports association of Amsterdam, the SSA. All Amsterdam student sports clubs are registered there and receive a subsidy for each student member. The amount of money BLOK receives depends on the number of student members and to be able to do this we are forced to share this information about you with them. If we do not do this, riding with us would become a lot more expensive and the vision of BLOK will be lost.

To secure the privacy, we have a statement with the parties named above.

Storage period

Your data will be kept for a long period by A.S.R. BLOK, but never longer than is necessary for carrying out activities, unless we must keep your data for longer because of legal regulations.

Rights

- Right of access: always, you can request your personal data to view it.
- Right to rectification: if there is an error in your data, you can pass this on to us and we must adjust it for you.
- Right to submit a complaint: you have the right to file a complaint. This goes via: Authority Personal Data.
- Right of transfer: if you wish to transfer to another association, you have the right to transfer your data to that party.
- Right to stop the use of data: you have the right to indicate that you no longer want us to use your data.

The use of these rights can be done via bestuurblok@gmail.com with the sending of a copy of ID-proof whereby the passport photo, the numbers at the bottom of the passport, ID-proof number and BSN are made illegible. The aim is to respond within a week.

Starting from study year 18/19 the BLOK-board and committees will have to sign a statement that says they are not allowed to share any of your personal data with thirds parties. Also, they agree to keep all the passwords a secret from anybody that is not in the current board. If they do so, they can be charged with invasion of privacy.
